The major issue at home is with the adolescent children as they annoy the team with their defiance. Most of them wouldn't show interest in going to school or to care the teachers and other inmates. It seems they need psychological counselling which the Sannihita HO is trying to provide.

Challenges like this are part of the process and they may disturb but cannot deter the spirit. At Sannihita, the team is always strive to provide the children and society with best services they can offer. They learn, they improve and they implement and it's a continuous and evolving process.
